OPEN FOR APPLICATIONS

FROM 14 OCTOBER TO 8 NOVEMBER 2024

ANNOUNCEMENT: This is a call for young Timorese presently enrolled in any registered educational institution, public or private, or a member/affiliate of any arts-oriented program or institution, to submit a poster entry in the format stated portraying or illustrating her/his personal understanding of anti-corruption, the damaging effects of corruption to Timorese society and her/his family, and to include a graphic representation of how she/he can personally support the national effort to fight corruption.

What are the objectives of the program:

- To promote and nurture the power of young Timorese minds in exploring innovative solutions to good governance or anti-corruption challenges.
- To increase levels of awareness of young Timorese of basic issues involving integrity, good governance and anti-corruption, and the importance of their involvement in the national effort against corruption and provide concrete opportunities for them to get involved.
- To harness the creativity of young people in expressing their thoughts and ideas via artistic expression regarding pressing issues pertaining to integrity, good governance and anti-corruption.
- To recognize and highlight diverse youth ideas and opinions expressed by way of the arts regarding values of integrity, honesty, good conduct, and ethical behavior.
- To encourage greater participation of students and the youth in the national effort against corruption.

Eligibility

- The competition is open to all bonafide students of registered educational institutions or a member/affiliate of any arts-oriented program or institution, or a young professional at the time of submission.
- Must be between 18 years to 35 years of age at the time of submission
- Must be a citizen of Timor-Leste.
- Women and people from diverse backgrounds are strongly encouraged to apply.
- Poster-entries are limited to original works that have not been previously released as any printed, web-based, or other advertisement done before.

Benefits to Winners

- Access to learning and networking opportunities.
- Contestants will contribute to the national discourse on anti-corruption efforts
- Greater access to opportunities for professional development
- Recognition as the winning posters will be published on the PDHJ website and other social media channels.
- The winner will receive a prize to be provided by the PDHJ

Poster Design Guidelines

- Posters could be in watercolor, oil, acrylic, colored pencil, charcoal, pen or computerized design.
- Readable and attractive font size & color.
- All entries must be sensitive to the diverse culture of Timor-Leste and should not denigrate or offend any individual or sector of the community.
- Submissions must be the original unpublished work of the competitor.
- Submissions prepared for other competitions are not eligible.
- Plagiarism/copying will result in outright disqualification.
- Each entry must be accompanied by a cover sheet providing the following information on the competitor: name, age and contact details – address, mobile number, mailing address and email address, if available.

Submission Deadline

- All poster-entries must be submitted on or before November 8, 2024.

Submission Instructions

- Poster-entries, which must be sized **18 inches x 24 inches (45.72cm x 60.96cm)**, follow the design guidelines above, and must be submitted in the original form to the Competition Secretariat together with a cover sheet with the contestant's name, age, and contact details (mailing address, email address, mobile number) at the address provided below.
